- 6. Teacher, Family or Professional Feedback Form

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR PROGRAM (iPhoto)

- 1. Must create a slideshow or book with a minimum of 20 slides
- 2. Mapping and Labeling (facing) on a minimum of 3 photos
- 3. Adding effects to a minimum of 1 photo.
- 4. Crop, remove red eye or adjust photo properties on a minimum of 1 picture
- 5. Justify how you would share this product. Presentation, social networking or print.
- 6. Bibliography page- if used photos from an online source
