The purpose of this course is to prepare you for a future where you can properly harness fundamental web design skills. The course covers Hypertext Markup Language (HTML), CSS Style Sheets and introduces students to Dreamweaver, Photoshop, and PDF writer as it pertains to Web Design. Students will do text and classroom work in addition to peer group activities and independent projects. Students will create 3 Websites each serving a different purpose and audience. Many professions value an employee who is proficient in the basics of HTML and Adobe Dreamweaver. This class will provide you with the skills necessary to use these technologies in such a way that you would be confident in adding them to your resume.
