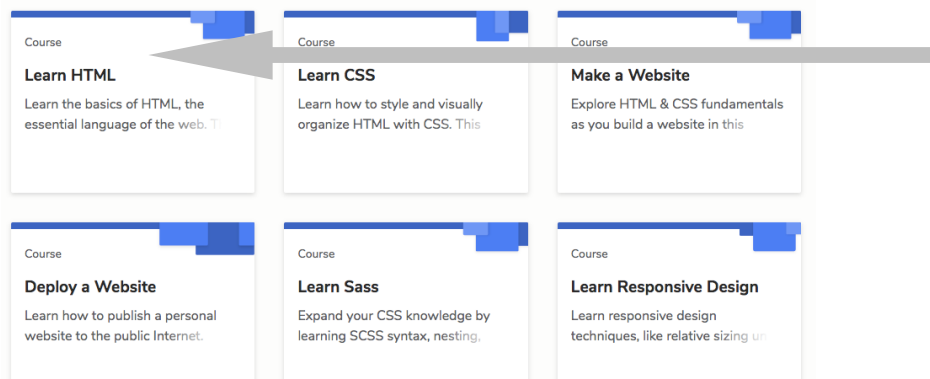


Codecademy, Intro. to HTML Basics Assignment

Directions


1. Go to <https://www.codecademy.com> and create an account (if you do not have one already.) Once you have created an account go to the “Learn HTML” course. This can be found in many locations on the Website but I find the easiest place to find it is in the footer “By Language” (HTML & CSS)

2. Follow the lessons step by step. There are 16 lessons in this chapter. Do not worry we are not doing the full 3 hour training. For each lesson read the content on the left side and apply the directions on the right side where the text editor is located.
